Zoom Conferencing with MPFA

Business Reform Issues Arising from Launch of e-MPF

Zoom conferencing amid Covid-19 MPFA approached PSA in mid February to discuss on business reform issues arising from the launch of e-MPFA, including *MPFSO Section 41: Persons not to disclose certain information*.

In view of the Covid-19 situation, Zoom Conferencing was used instead of in-person meeting. Mr. Leo Chu (COO & ED) and Ms. Gabriella Yee (ED – Policy) co-hosted the web conference, together with Mr. Joseph Lee (Director – Product Regulations) and team, and all six Founding Members of PSA participated at the web conference. The web conference



was as interactive and productive as a phycial meeting.

MPFA invited PSA to submit a proposal for further discussion with FSTB and DOJ by end of March. PSA drafted a discussion paper and collected feedback from all Sponsors, addressing views on Section 41 and other topics (e.g. digital by default, mandatory e-MPF take-up).

The discussion paper was submitted to MPFA on March 23rd.
